Virginia's Climate



a mild climate with distinct seasons, spring summer, fall and winter. there is a wide variety of vegetation (plants)

What Virginia's Indians are referred to as, because of the forests which cover most of the land.

Winter: hunted birds, lived on stored foods from the previous fall Spring: hunted, fished, picked berries Summer: grew crops (beans, corn, squash)

Fall: harvested crops and hunted for foods to preserve and keep for the winter


